#### **ABOUT ROBERT CURRAN**



DANIELLE ROWE, CHOREOGRAPHER

#### **CHOREOGRAPHER'S NOTES**

Set during a weekly counseling session for oddballs and outsiders, four well known story-ballet disruptors share their stories. As each character revisits the moment that shaped their personality, the audience witnesses that moment told through dance. Completely created remotely, and even in different time zones, this short dance film came together through great tenacity, flexibility, and generosity of the dancers and with the unwavering support of Louisville Ballet's artistic and production staff.

#### **ABOUT**

Choreographer Danielle Rowe was born in Shepparton, Australia and trained at the Australian Ballet School.

Rowe has created works for San Francisco Ballet, Nederlands Dans Theater's SWITCH program, Royal New Zealand Ballet, Co.Lab Dance (featuring dancers from American Ballet Theater), Ballet Idaho, Grand Rapids Ballet, SFDanceworks, Barak Ballet, Diablo Ballet, Oakland Ballet and Berkeley Ballet Theater.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Rowe pivoted to film making; writing, choreographing and directing eight dance films, namely Wooden Dimes for San Francisco Ballet which was hailed "a modern masterpiece" (Rachel Howard, SF Chronicle) and Wilis in Corps-en-tine for The Australian Ballet (with creative partner, Garen Scribner) which was voted "one of the best things to come out of quarantine" by Vogue.

From 2001-2015 Rowe was a Principal Dancer with the Australian Ballet and Houston Ballet, and also danced with the prestigious Nederlands Dans Theater. She is the former Associate Artistic Director of SFDanceworks.

Rowe lives in San Francisco, California.

#### **CHOREOGRAPHER'S NOTES**

I have resisted the urge to say that A l'œuvre on connaît l'artisan is a Covid-inspired work. While I still believe that, it is also impossible to ignore the role Covid played in its creation. A l'œuvre explores the dynamic between the Dancer, the Space, and the Music as equal, necessary partners; something that was impossible to have together at the height of the pandemic. As we took our first steps back into the studios in August, the fear and trepidation surrounding the experience was matched only by the happiness of bringing those elements together again. Those initial moments back provided the inspiration for this work.

Beyond the dynamics above, various relationships are explored by the other dancers. Intimacy, playfulness, and antagonism provided the initial framework for how they engaged with the music and the space, which in turn added further complexity to those respective emotions. When brought together, it is my hope that you experience the same transcendent calm and reverent joy I felt all those months ago.

A special thank you to every artist involved in the creation of this work. I bow to your collective grace, tenacity, and artistry that inspires me daily.

#### **ABOUT**

Justin is from nearby Cincinnati, Ohio, where he received his initial training at the School for the Creative and Performing Arts. He furthered his education and training at Mercyhurst University, earning his B.A. in Dance Performance and Choreography. Professionally, Justin began his career at the North Carolina Dance Theatre (now Carolina Ballet) before joining St. Louis Ballet. In 2012, Justin joined Louisville Ballet. Since then, he has the wonderful opportunity to work with former Artistic Directors Bruce Simpson, Helen Starr and the late Alun Jones, and choreographers Daniel Riley (Tonal), Lucas Jervies (Firebird), Val Caniparoli (A Cinderella Story), Andrea Schermoly (At High), Ronald Hynd (The Merry Widow), and Adam Hougland (Romeo + Juliet) among others.

## THE MOVEMENT

SANJAY SAVERIMUTTU, CHOREOGRAPHER

#### CHOREOGRAPHER'S NOTES

This new work explores the dynamics of queer friendships, chosen family, and other non-romantic relationships developed within the LGBTQ+ community, set against the backdrop of racial protests in Louisville. In collaboration with playwright, Allie Fireel, and artist Cris Eli Blak, *The Movement* is a dance/theatre hybrid performance, seeking to combine voice, movement, and technology in one performance space

#### **ABOUT**

Sanjay Saverimuttu is a Louisville-based choreographer who aims to develop the art form of contemporary ballet beyond its European hetero-normative base. Sanjay has received commissions for his own choreography from the Louisville Ballet, the Louisville Ballet Youth Ensemble, Boca Ballet Theatre, Waterfront Botanical Gardens, Ballet Arkansas, and the University of Kentucky. Sanjay is a member of the second generation of the Hadley Creatives and served as an Artist in Residence at the University of Kentucky. He has been featured in Pointe Magazine, co-produced Dis/Comfort Zones at Actors Theatre of Louisville, and hosts a book club through Louisville Pride Foundation. Sanjay has been a Louisville Ballet Company Artist since 2012.

### CIRCADIAN

NATALIE ORMS, CHOREOGRAPHER

#### **CHOREOGRAPHER'S NOTES**

Circadian dives into the emotions of a sleepless night. It explores movement through feelings of anxiety, anger, and exhaustion. Following the dancers through a dream like state. Leaving you questioning what was real and what was just a dream.

The choices I made for this piece were inspired by the emotions I went through during the pandemic. Most everyone has had anxiety about the events of this past year, especially my young peers. The main challenge was helping them find those emotions within my choreography and challenge their movement qualities.

The filming process was so exciting and something I had never been a part of. I knew we would be filming from the very beginning so I planned this piece around the different shots I wanted to take. I used the music as a blueprint to find distinct sections and transitions. From there I experimented with ideas for camera angles including aerial views and hand held follow cameras.

In the end I am very proud and grateful to my peers for helping this vision come to fruition. I could not have done it without the hardwork and dedication of my cast and the Ballet Mistress Mikelle Bruzina.

#### **ABOUT**

Natalie Orms was born and raised in Louisville, Ky. She started her training at the University of Louisville Dance Academy before transferring to The Louisville Ballet School. Natalie attended the Youth Performing Arts School at duPont Manual High School as a dance major, and became a member of the Louisville Ballet School Ensemble. Natalie attended several summer intensive programs including The Harid Conservatory, Atlanta Ballet, and Miami City Ballet. After graduating from high school, she joined the trainee program at Louisville Ballet which has since become the Louisville Ballet Studio Company. During her four year tenure, she had the privilege of training with the Artistic team of Louisville Ballet including Artistic Director, Robert Curran, as well as performing in Louisville Ballet production corps de ballet roles including Giselle (Curran), The Merry Widow (Hynde), Serenade (Balanchine), and The Brown Forman Nutcracker (Caniparoli). Circadian is Natalie's first choreographed work, created in her final year with the Studio Company.


#### **ABOUT**
